NATURE: While assigned as school liaison officers, Deputy Haglund and I were working a Rochester Community Schools School Board meeting at 501 W. University.

DETAILS: It was an evening School Board meeting with school board Members, administrators and members of the public present at the meeting. Deputy Haglund and I alternating sitting in the room where the meeting was being held. Throughout the meeting, members of the public are allotted three minutes to speak. At the beginning of the meeting, the Board listed rules/ policies that they asked the public to follow which included keeping masks on.

Several members of the public took their three minutes of time to express there dissatisfaction

with how the District was handling Covid 19 quarantined kids along with issues with the Caring Steps building. At one point a member of the public, Andrew Weaver, came up to speak reference his dissatisfaction with the district and pulled his mask off while speaking. The board president, Kristin Bull, asked Mr. Weaver to please put his mask back on. Mr. Weaver argued stating that at a prior meeting a district employee was allowed to take her mask off. Mr. Weaver was arguing double standards as Mrs. Bull continued to asked that he "Please" put his mask back on.

I was made aware of Mr. Weaver prior to the meeting due to multiple emails he has sent to the Board of Education including the superintendent, Robert Shaner. Mr. Weaver also has a Facebook advocacy page for members of the public that are also dissatisfied with the District. Several of the emails and post had been forwarded to the police department prior to the meeting. The Districts lawyer has also sent Mr. Weaver Cease and Desist letters for allegedly making false allegations and insults.

Mr. Weaver didn't pull his mask up as asked and was speaking over Mrs. Bull who was asking him to put it back on. It was at this point that the board called for a recess. Deputy Haglund and I went over and spoke to Mr. Weaver who immediately put his mask on. Mr. Weaver apologized to us and was not argumentative. As he headed back to his seat, the Board called for an adjournment. The members of the public became vocal expressing their displeasure for the meeting being adjourned and not being afforded the opportunity to speak.

The Board left the room yet Dr. Shaner stayed. Mr. Weaver yelled to him about the mask requirement as he got closer, entering into the area where the Board Members sitting. I approached Mr. Weaver and stated, "it's not worth it." Mr. Weaver replied, "I'm poking him." Mr. Weaver then went back into the area where the members of the public sit. One member of the public stood at the podium and gave her three minute speech to be heard even though the Board had left the room. A short time later, I was instructed that everyone had to leave the building. I advised the members of the public that they had to leave the building. They all respectfully left the building, including Mr. Weaver. Some of them even apologized to us for being put in that position.

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Hey Kristin,

It was interesting to learn that after a year in which you and the other BOE Trustees were responsible for ensuring the district was following safety guidelines regarding COVID, you do not know what the mask rules are.
