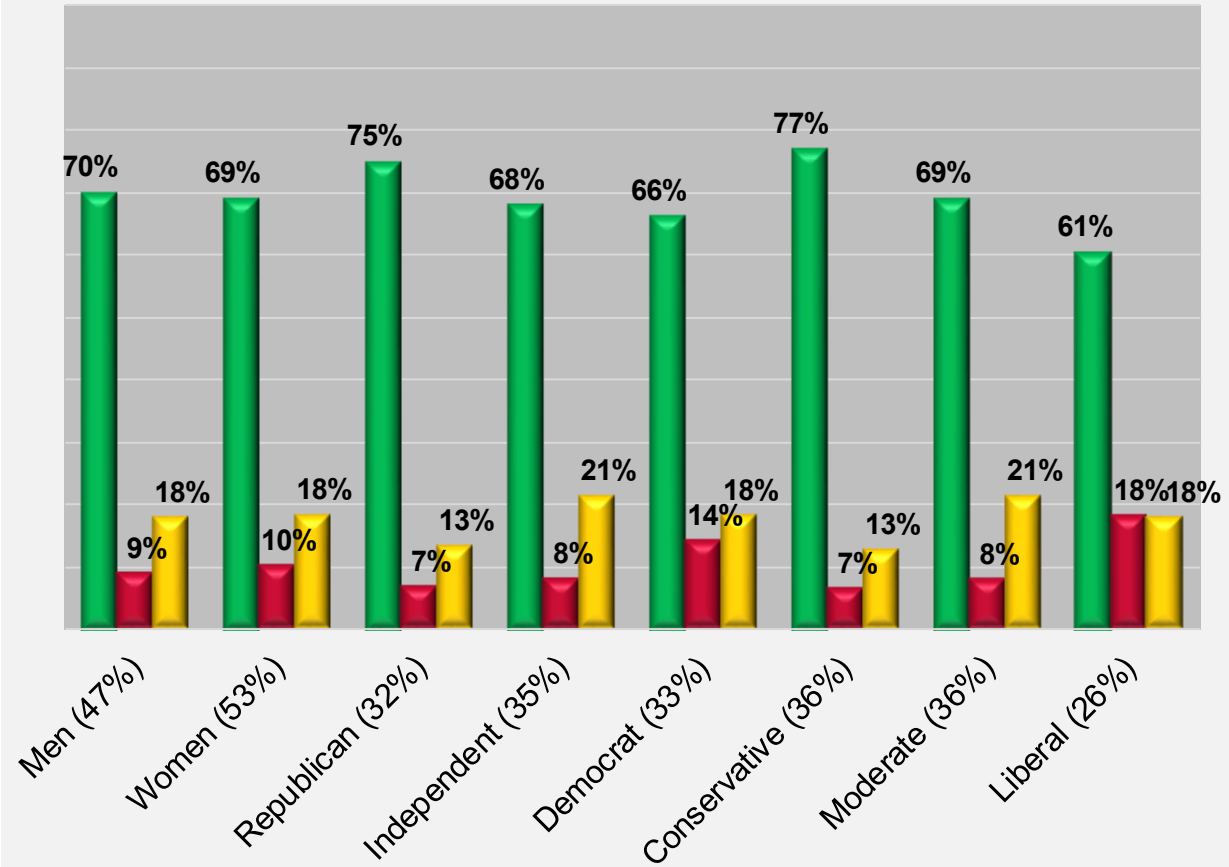
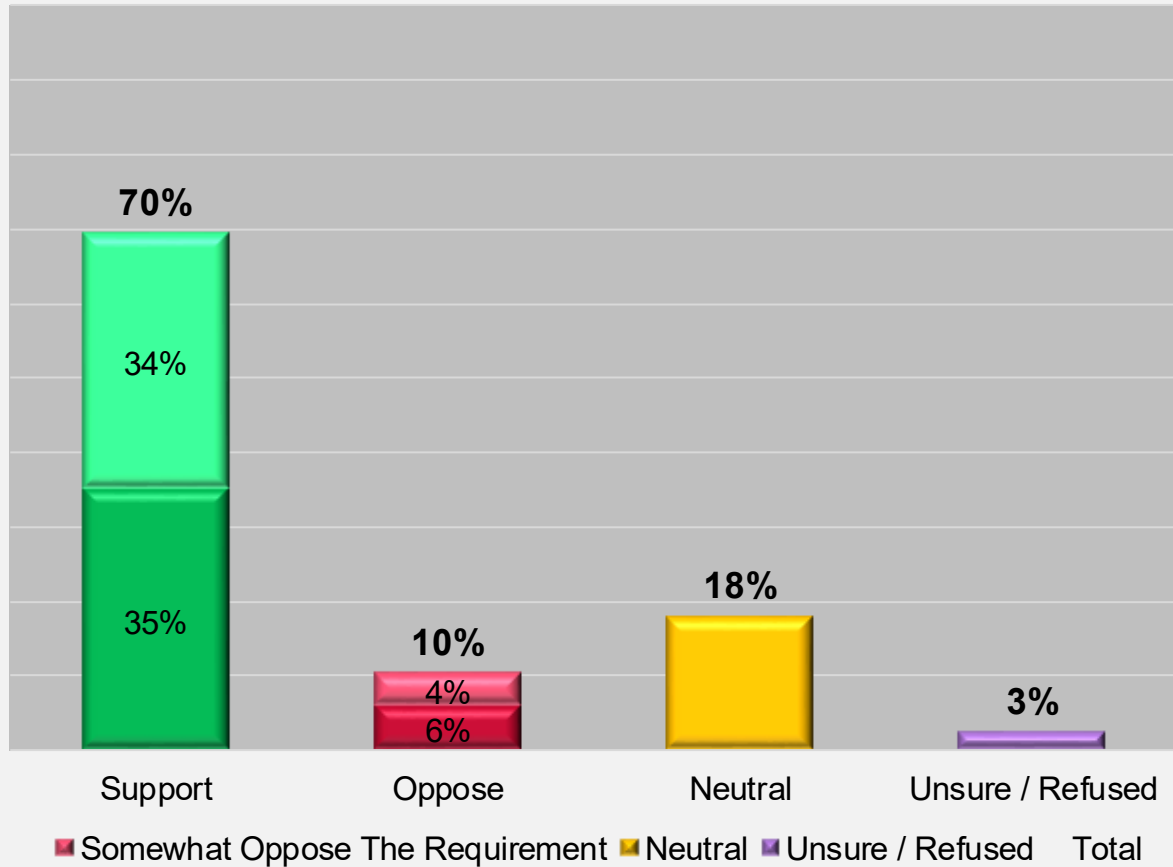
Methodology

- Online survey among 1,600 likely voters nationwide conducted March 12-18, 2026. Respondents were selected randomly from opt-in panel participants. Sampling controls were used to ensure that a proportional and representative number of respondents were interviewed from such demographic groups as age, gender, race, and geographic region.
 - Gender breakdown: 48% men – 52% women
 - Party ID breakdown: 33% Republican, 34% Independent, 32% Democrat
- $\pm 2.45\%$ overall margin of error at the 95% confidence interval for overall survey. M.O.E.s for subgroups are larger.

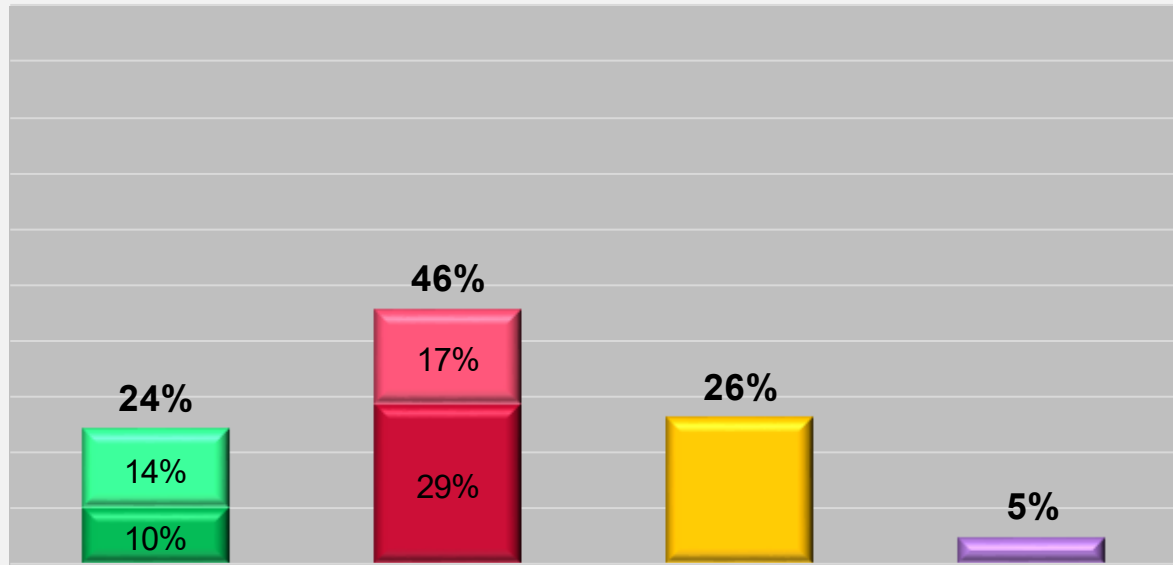

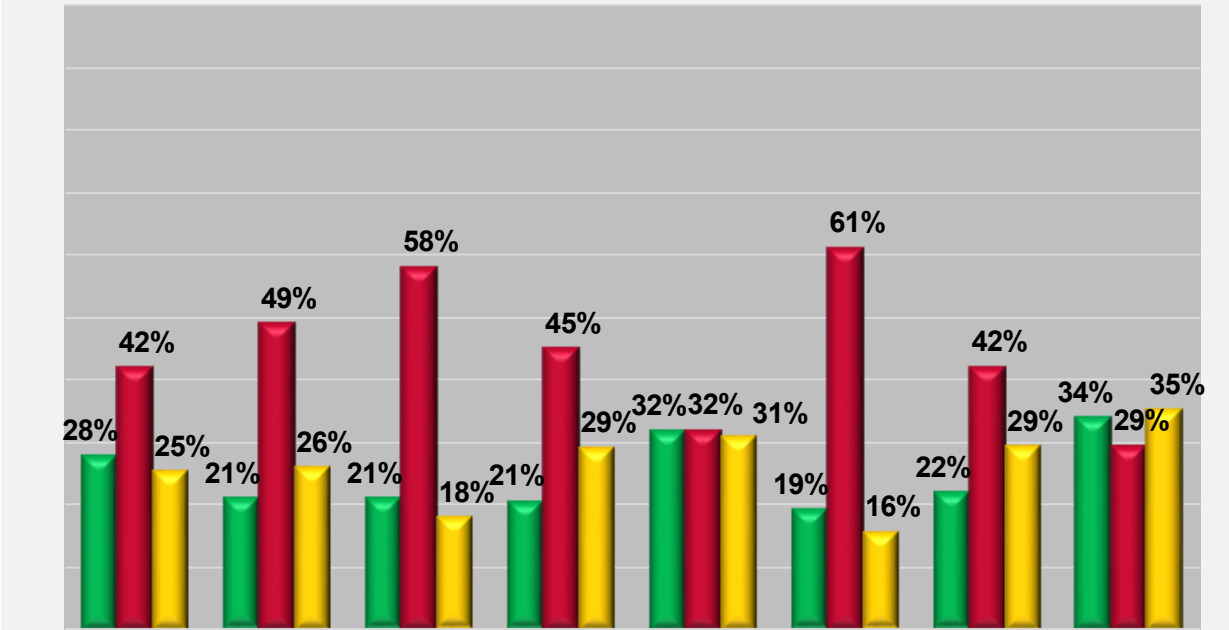

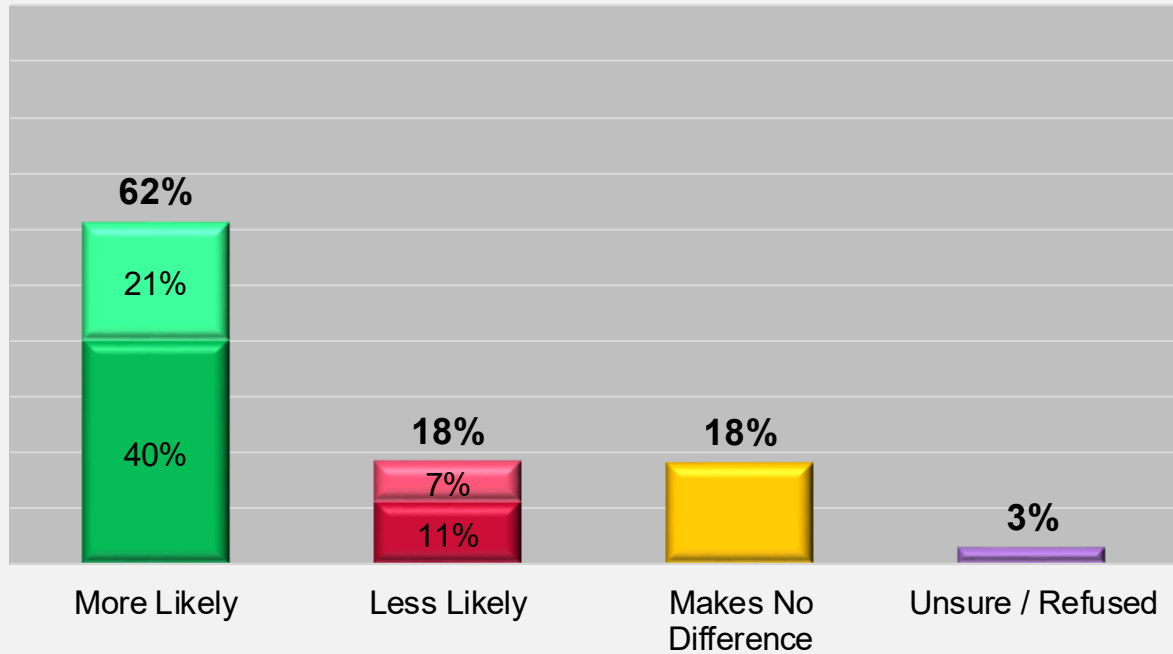

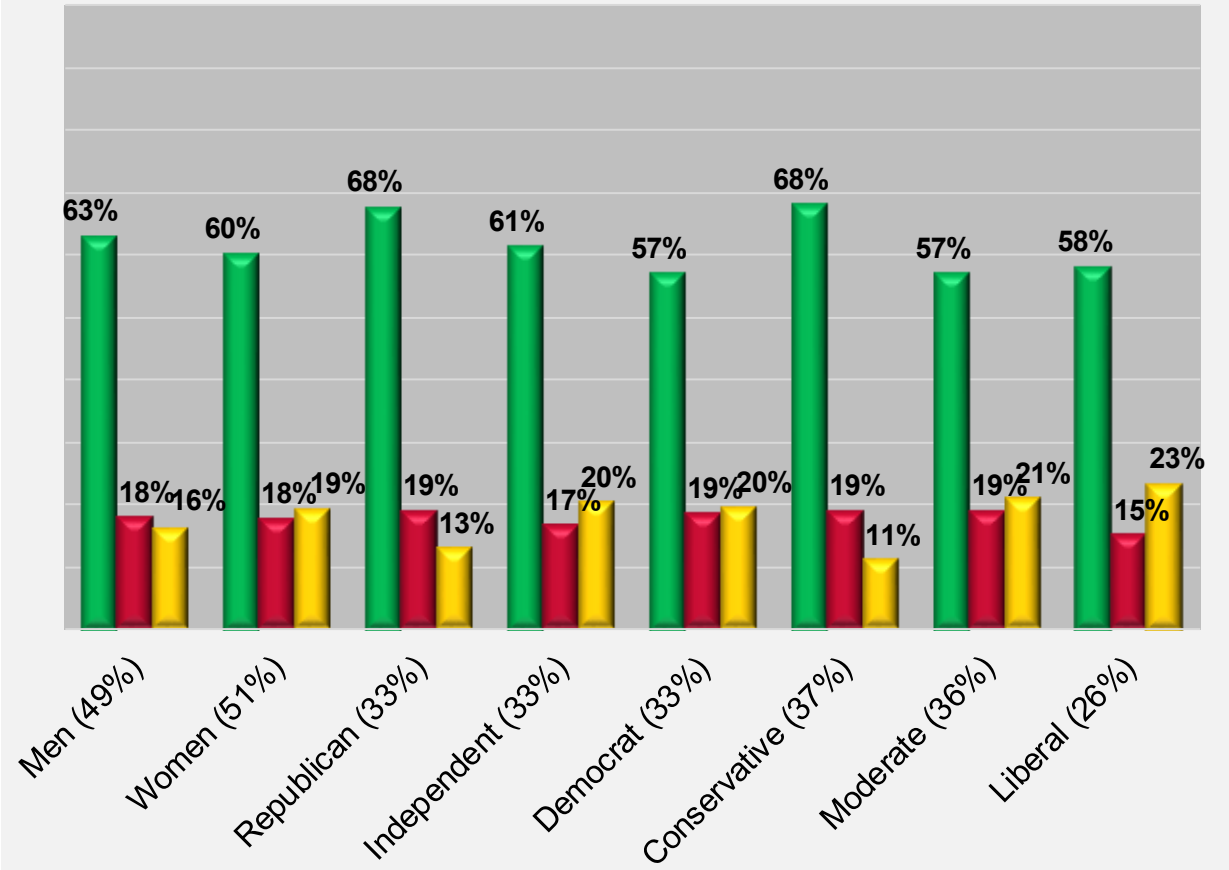


Men (47%) Women (53%) Republican (33%) Independent (36%) Democrat (29%) Conservative (35%) Moderate (39%) Liberal (24%)

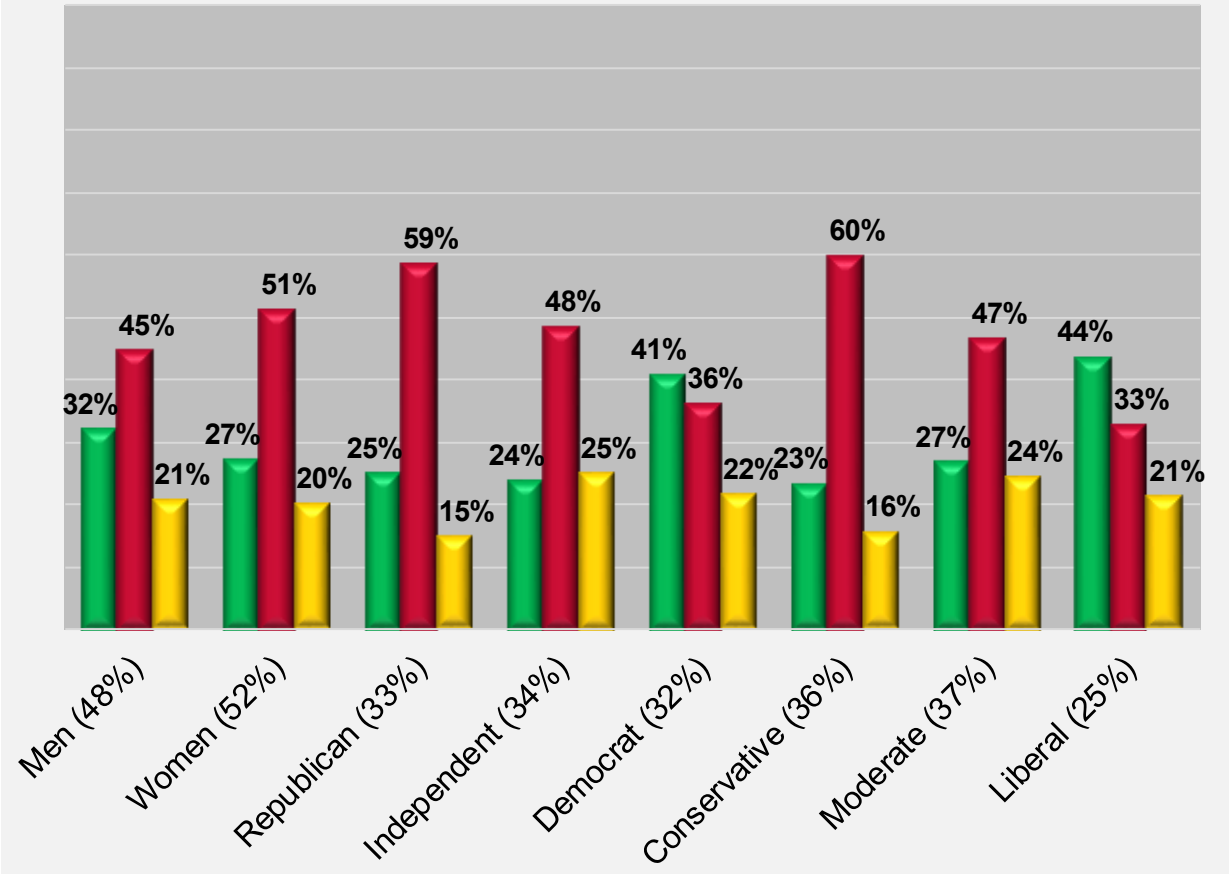

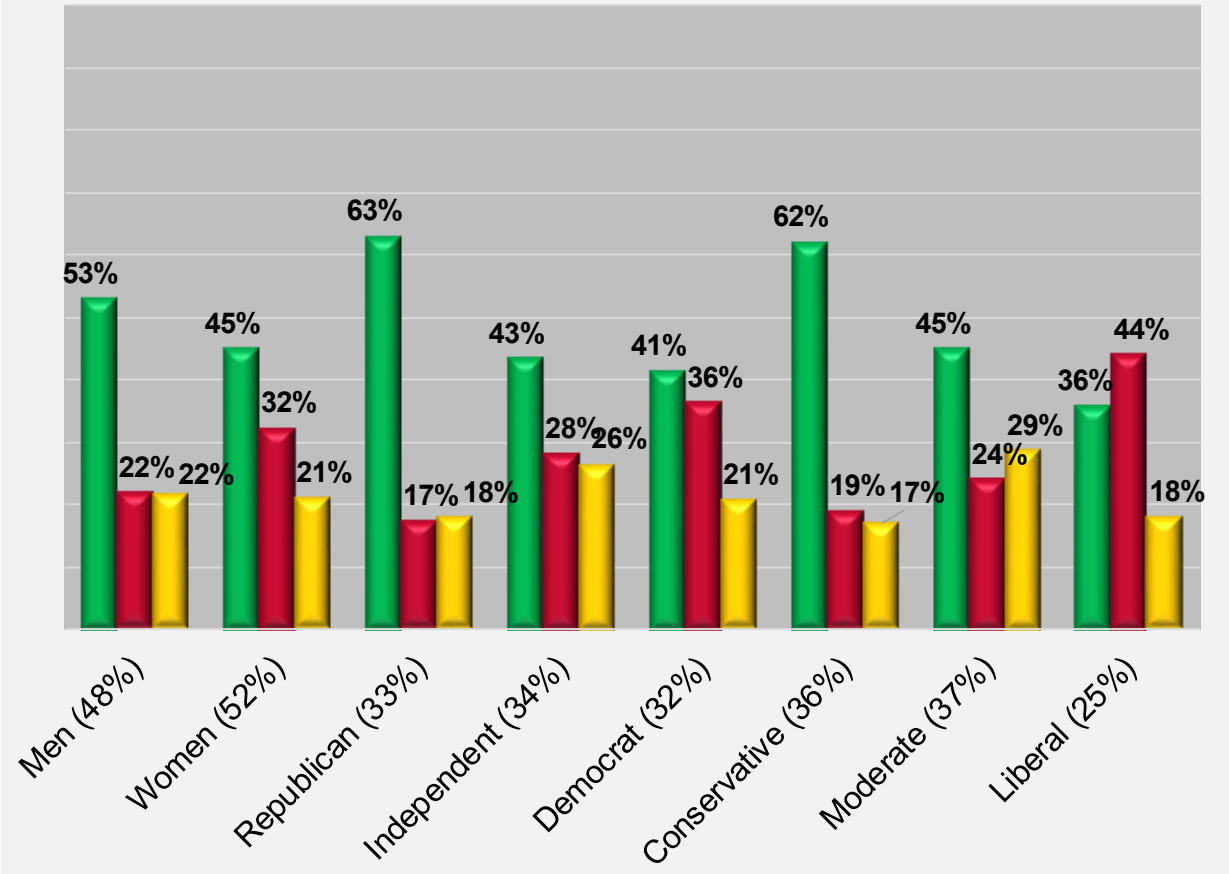
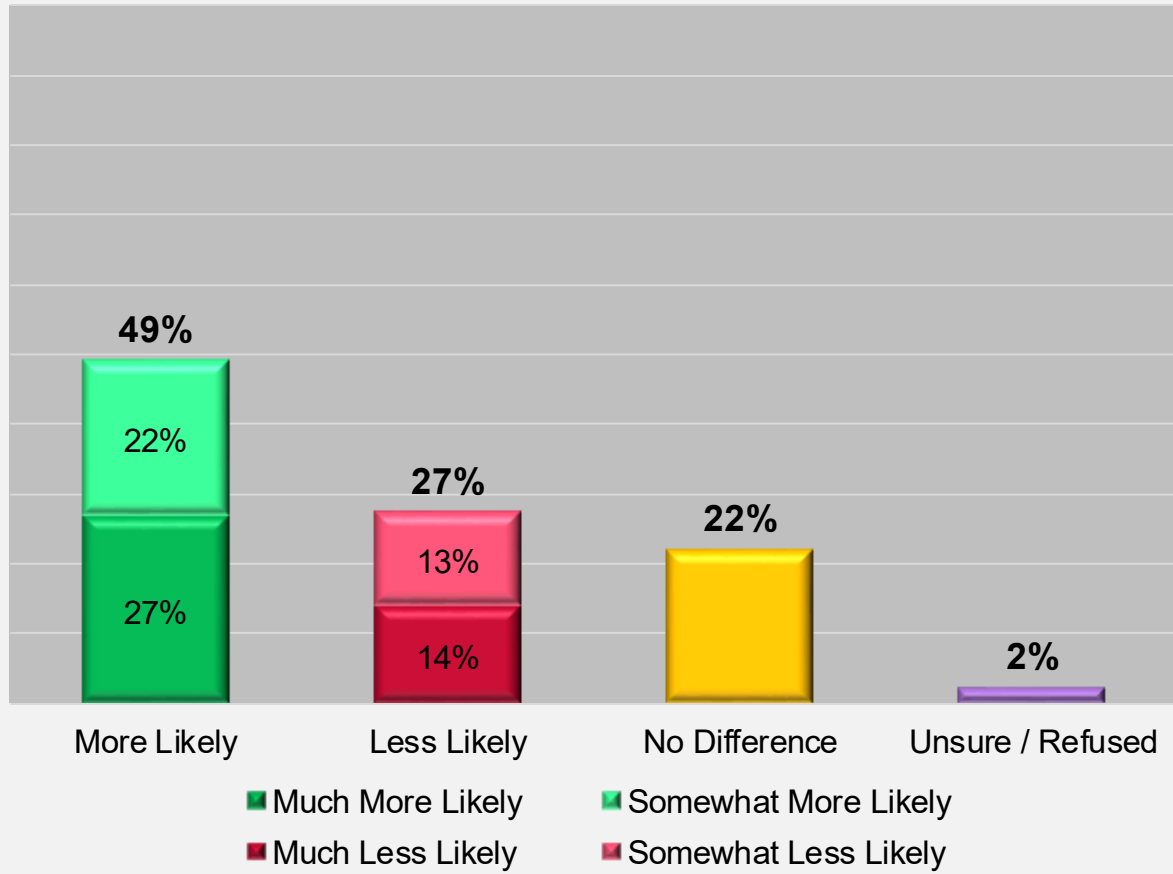
Thinking about your elected representative, would you be more likely or less likely to support them based on the following positions?

Your representative supported allowing abortion pills to be ordered online and delivered by mail without a medical evaluation.



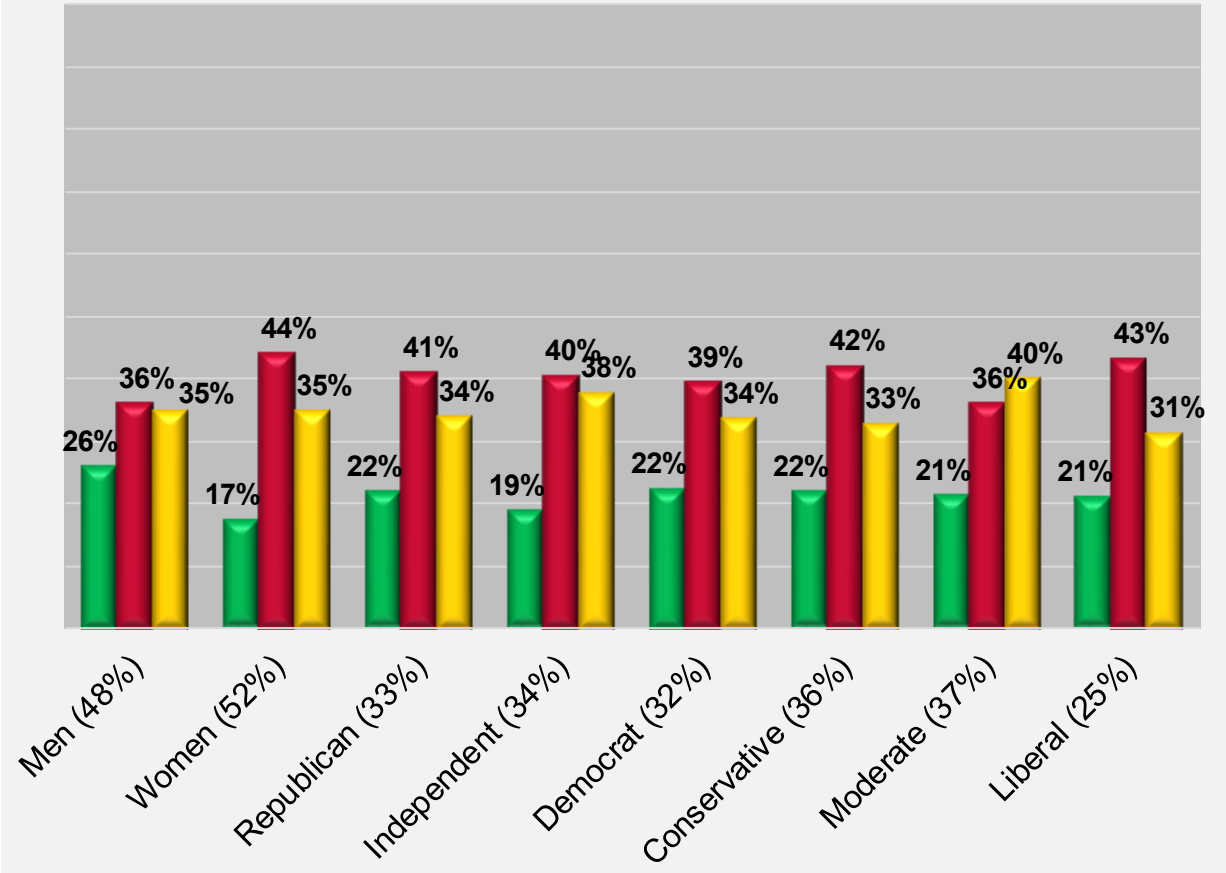
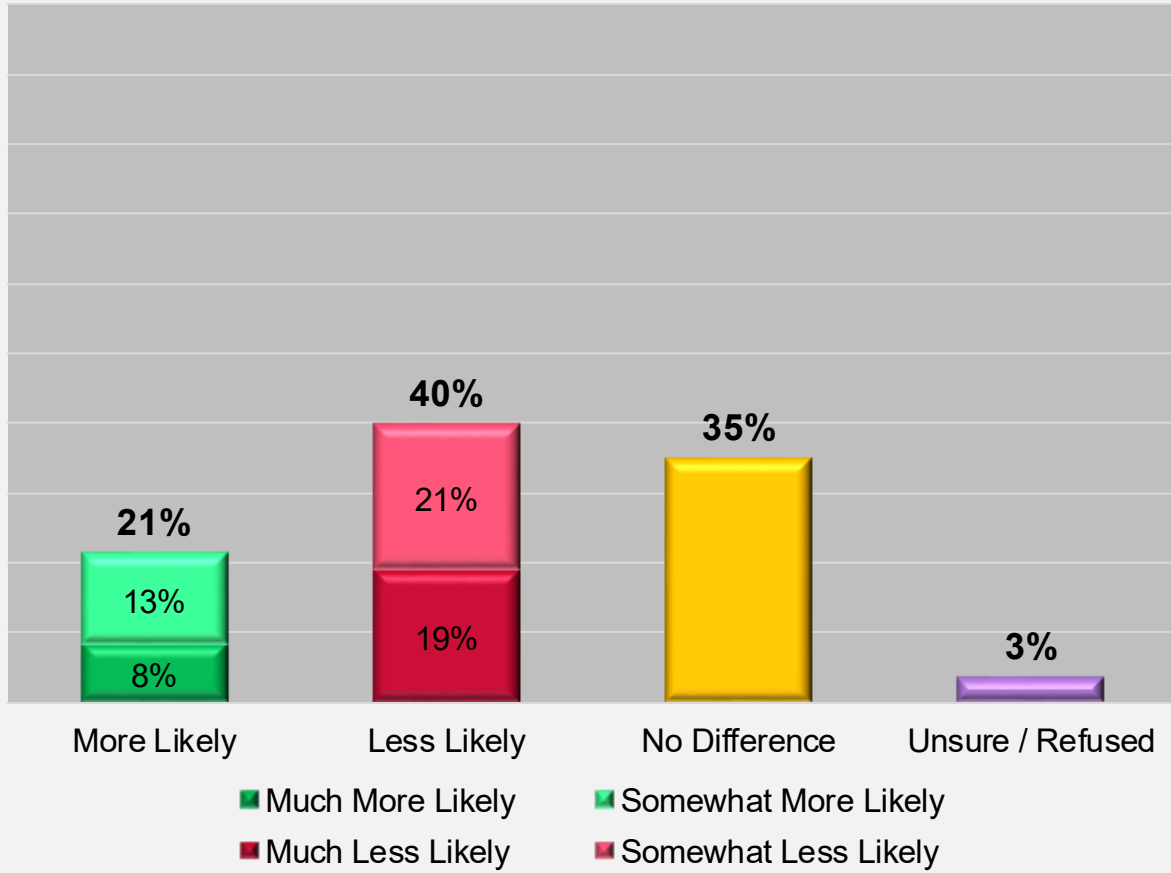
Thinking about your elected representative, would you be more likely or less likely to support them based on the following positions?
